

Broadview Lodge, Nelson Court, University of East Anglia, Norwich Research Park, Norwich NR4 7TJ to John Innes Centre, Norwich Research Park, Norwich NR4 7UH.

It is only a 20-25 min walk between the accommodation and the conference venue via a very pleasant walking/cycling-only route, with lighting, so we encourage this route.

Bus routes from Broadview Lodge at University of East Anglia (UEA) to John Innes Centre (JIC) or city centre:

First Bus, blue line, route 26. This is the best bus to get between UEA and JIC but only travels that part of its route on **Monday to Friday**. It is also the most direct bus between the railway station and the UEA, for people arriving in Norwich by train. **It will be possible to reach UEA from the railway station on Sunday and to return there on Thursday or Good Friday using this bus.** It runs every half an hour in both directions all day and continues late into the evening for the part of the route between UEA and the city centre, so is useful if you want to visit the city in the evenings. For Mon-Thurs of the conference, bus 26 leaves the main stop (A) on University Drive at 8.48am and arrives at the JIC stop just before 9am (JIC is the stop before reaching the Norfolk and Norwich hospital, so arrival is a couple of minutes earlier than on the timetable, which only shows arrival at the hospital). The next bus leaves UEA at 9.18, arriving at JIC just before 9.30. Route 26 returns from JIC to UEA every half an hour in the early evening, e.g. at 5.10, 5.40, 6.10, 6.40, 7.10, 7.40pm – **beware, this is the last one from JIC!** From UEA, the route continues to city centre and railway station.

Alternatively, route 512 Konectbus leaves University Drive (from stop C) at 9.03am, **Mon to Fri only**, and arrives at Colney Lane (opposite JIC) at 9.07am. It is a more expensive route but is a back-up if you miss bus 26 and really don't want to walk!

Return for route 512 departs the hospital (stop B) at 5.20pm and 6.25pm so pick up outside JIC will be a couple of mins later, and arrives at UEA main stop A.

NOTE: Neither bus company runs along the part of the route between UEA and JIC on Sundays or late evenings. Therefore, on Sunday and if leaving JIC after 7.40pm during the week, you will need to walk between JIC and UEA.

Airport: UEA

There are always taxis at the airport. The two nearest bus stops to Norwich Airport are located on the Cromer Road adjacent to Tesco Express. There is a direct walking route from the terminal, turn left out of the terminal, walk past the RBS building along a footpath towards Fifers Lane – 8 minutes. There does not appear to be a direct bus route to UEA but there are many routes from the airport to city centre (e.g. the main bus station or Red Lion Street), then from city centre to UEA is easy, e.g. route 25/26 (see link above).
