4. Report from Section Chair

“Once again it has been a busy year for our Committee. I will report separately on our 3 themes: School’s Outreach, Professional CPD and Public outreach.

a. Schools Outreach

MAK:

The MAK continues to be a success and I can report that we have reached 67,929 children to date not counting the international projects. We don’t get feedback from everyone, and we don’t include the festivals and events, so this is an underestimate. It is helping to develop interest in science and also helping teachers to develop cross curricular activities linking science to other areas in the curriculum in imaginative and creative ways. We conducted and impact study of the kits with a PG student, Aaron Horsey, undertaking a 3 month placement with the Society and found interesting outcomes around engaging students beyond science, in cross curricular activities and in ‘hard to reach’ children. Interestingly, our work with County Print has had a really positive impact on that organisation which works with people with learning difficulties.

We continue to expand our international links including MSI to UoNMC who have led sessions for refugee children as well as local schools.

Finish with a quote - “The kit was the best I have experienced in over 20 years of teaching; the quality of the activities, the resources that were all provided so nothing had to be brought in, the quality of the microscopes. From the first activity, children were enthralled by what they discovered and saw.
