#### **Outreach Events**

One of the year's highly successful public outreach events supported by the RMS was April's Big Bang @ Weston Science and Engineering Festival at Weston-super-Mare.

More than 2,500 people attended over two days, including at least 1,600 children. The RMS was among more than 40 exhibitors, and our school binocular microscopes were a big hit with children, teachers and parents. One of the microscopes was given as a prize for competition winners Staplegrove Primary School from Taunton.

Our Microscope Activity Kits continue to be very popular and we are now taking bookings for Spring 2020. We now have Kits based in Guernsey, Scotland and Ireland. Since the MAKs were launched they have been used by over 86.000 children.
